### **1. Should the paper be related to Tomioka Silk Mill and Related Sites?**

→ No. A paper on another site or case that fits the theme of one of the four sessions can be accepted.

### **2. Should a case study be limited to built heritage?**

→ No. We welcome papers that present a case study of a natural site, for instance, as long as it fits the theme(s) of the sessions well.

### **3. How much are registration fees?**

→ No registration fees are required. Registered participants will be guided to purchase meal coupons in advance.

### **4. Is there a plan to publish contributions to the symposium?**

→ Yes. Post-symposium publications will be organized based on the peer review system.

### **5. Is there financial support for participants' traveling?**
